

Kensington Market is all these things and more.

Kensington Market is an eclectic and richly textured area of shops, cafes, food stores, Victorian homes and coach houses, lively sidewalks and alleys. Its approximate boundaries are College and Dundas Streets to the north and south, Spadina and Bathurst to the east and west.

A major landing area since the early 1900s to waves of Jewish, Italian, Portuguese, Chinese, Latin American and other immigrants, the area's earliest residents arrived in the early 1800s and numerous Victorian-era houses still stand. The neighbourhood was designated a national historic site in 2006.

The Society's first planning meeting took place at 80 Bellevue Avenue on June 24, 2012, and the Society was incorporated as a not-for-profit Ontario corporation on November 29, 2012.
